
All at Standstill - No Looting During Blackout

The Bnai Brak Haggadah

Everyone is talking about the historic Bnai Brak Haggadah that predates the famous Amsterdam, Venice or Frankfurt Haggadah masterpieces in prestigious museums and private collections.

This Bnai Brak Haggadah is so rare that there is no actual copy extant of this unusual work.

Exotic Haggadahs are known for their beautiful gold leaf, woodcuts & engravings, intricate designs and colorful margins resplendent with chirping birds and blossoming flowers, created with great talent and painstaking detail.

Disclaimer: The Bnai Brak Haggadah has no superficial decorations or external embellishments. Rather than fancy calligraphy on expensive vellum, it is rich with original commentary studded with priceless treasure of Torah gems.

In this Haggadah the Sages draw on their distinctive styles, an art to itself.

This is not your simple layman's Haggadah. At first glance, it consists of only one or two paragraphs. But the full and unabridged transcript of this Haggadah could fill many volumes, enough reading for an all nighter.

Practically speaking, it is not recommended for most of us at the Seder, our stomachs grumbling and looking forward to end the reading and begin the eating.

A marvel of stamina and persistence, this Haggadah is no comfortable bedtime reading to fall asleep. On the contrary. Reverberating with intense Halachic dispute and debate, the friction of brilliant Talmudic crossfire illuminates the night, it keeps the reader awake to the end, concluding with a shining example of inter-generational study by the authors' disciples.

To paraphrase the NYT Sunday edition: "You don't have to read it all, but it's good to know it's all there."
